

Latest Round-ups:

Midweek Action: Despite the weather attempting to wreak havoc with the midweek schedule, Warminster's home game with Gillingham in the First Division went ahead, with both sides taking home a point. Aaron Lane-Leney had put the visitors ahead ten minutes before the interval, but the hosts hit back instantly and managed to secure a share of the spoils. Elsewhere on Wednesday, Cribbs Reserves qualified for the next round of the Les Phillips Cup with a thrilling shootout victory over Odd Down, after the game finished four-all at the end of 90 minutes. The hosts responded to an early set-back by forging ahead, with Liam Clayton's brace putting them 2-1 up. Ben Millett then struck shortly after to level affairs, with the Bath side taking control of the tie early in the second half thanks to a pair of quickfire goals from Malick Jammeh and Raphael Waugh. The goals continued to fly in, and after Tom Headford got the hosts third of the night, they then struck again in stoppage time through Archie Lock to send the game to penalties. Cribbs were then successful with four of their five spot kicks, while the visitors converted just two, seeing the home side progress by the barest of margins.

Premier Division: Helston stretched their lead at the top to four points after completing a hard-fought 2-0 win away at Buckland. Jordan Copp tucked home a penalty early in the second half to break the deadlock, before Rikki Sheppard then put Helston two goals clear with a close range effort 20 minutes from time. Second-placed Clevedon ended their three-match losing run, but could only muster a point away at Wellington, drawing 0-0 with their fellow Somerset-side. The form-side from elsewhere in the district is Bridgwater, with a dominant away performance helping them trounce Oldland Abbotonians by seven goals to one. Two early strikes from Jack Thorne helped United forge ahead, before the Abbots pulled a goal back on the half hour. That was as good as it got for the hosts however, and after an own goal helped restore the two-goal advantage, Bridgwater stormed home with Jay Murray, Jack Taylor and a late Josiah McKayle double helping to complete the rout. It was also a one-sided affair at Bickland Park, where doubles from Oscar Massey and Luke Barner helped Falmouth defeat Welton 6-0. Leading by four at the break, Falmouth were far too strong for their visitors, with Cam Hutchinson and Rubin Wilson also getting on the scoresheet to help Town rise into fourth spot. The only other home side to bag maximum

points on Saturday were Ilfracombe, after they struck late to see off ten-man St Blazey. The game had passed without incident until the hour mark when Sam Clifton's second yellow card saw him dismissed to give Town the upper hand. The numerical advantage paid off eventually, and with seven minutes left on the clock, Harry Taffs fired home to score the decisive goal. Barnstaple Town didn't wait as long to forge ahead in their clash with Torpoint, scoring twice inside the



opening quarter-hour on their way to victory. A brilliant finish from Stu Bowker set the ball rolling after only three minutes, with Billy Tucker adding another shortly after to complete the 2-0 victory.

In Cornwall, **Brixham** overturned an early deficit to win by three goals to one away at **Saltash**. After Kieran O'Melia had put the Ashes in front after 25 minutes, Brixham hit back instantly through Josh Parry to make it one apiece. Aaron Wellington then completed the turnaround just prior to half time, with Sean Adderley completed the scoring late on. 3-1 was also the winning margin for **Shepton Mallet**, completing a reverse of the defeat they suffered at the hands of **Nailsea & Tickenham** back in August. After Josh Jenkins had handed Shepton a ninth minute lead, the Swags hit back through Luke Osgood to level affairs midway through the first half. Jacob Sloggett then tucked home a penalty to put Mallet back in front, before Ethan Witchell wrapped things up 20 minutes from time.

First Division: League leaders **Portishead** racked up their 21st win of the campaign in the day's early kick-off, scoring three times in the final quarter to secure a 4-0 victory away at **Bristol Telephones**. A first-half penalty from Kyle Egan was all the separated the sides at the interval as Portishead attempted to overturn their recent blip. A long-range free kick from Mitch Osmond eased Town nerves further, before Egan and Ethan Feltham added some gloss to the scoreline in the closing stages. Portishead were among a raft of away winners on Saturday, with **Bradford Town** joining them thanks to some late drama at **Shirehampton**. The Bobcats led for the majority of the contest, with Owen Pearce's goal coming at the end of their first attack to give the visitors a dream start. It looked like all of Bradford's hard work had come undone following a late leveller from Scott Bamford, however they managed to go back in front during stoppage time with a goalkeeping error allowing Fabian Stanislas to poke the ball home for 2-1. There was much less drama in Bath where **Wincanton's** Matt Garner struck a hat-trick to help his side run out 5-0 winners over **Odd Down**

(pictured, right). A towering header from Lewis Townsend had already put the Wasps in front prior to Garner's first of the afternoon which came after 27 minutes of action. Connor Williams then extended the lead to three in the run-up to half-time, with Garner then scoring goals four and five just after the hour mark to round out the comprehensive victory. The highest scorers of the day were **Brislington**, with the fifth-placed side toppling



bottom-side **Bishop Sutton** in a one-sided affair at Lakeview. Former Sutton frontman Oaklan Buck stroked home the 25th minute opener for his current side, with Jay Malpas then netting shortly after to make it 2-0 at the interval. Bris then showed no mercy after the break, with Jordan Scadding, Jack Fillingham, Joe McLennan and Lewis Dunn all adding their name to the scoresheet, prior to a penalty save in added time from visiting keeper George Dorrington. For **Middlezoy Rovers**, it was Liam Winter who played a starring role, scoring in their half of their 3-0 victory away at **Hengrove**. After man-of-the-match Winter handed Rovers the half-time lead, Dan Lismore made it 2-0 with a well-placed header before Winter completed the scoring with a belter from long-range. Aaron Lane-Leney scored for the second time this week, notching the only goal of the game for **Gillingham** during their hard-fought win at home to **Cheddar**. Another man with two-in-two is new **Street** frontman Steve Murray, after he scored the opener in their 3-0 defeat of **Cadbury Heath**. Murray followed up last weeks winner with a first half strike this time around, with teammates Tom Hill and Joe Morgan both firing home in the closing stages to put some distance between the sides. Nothing could separate the times in the other two fixtures, with both **Keynsham** and **Warminster**, and also **Bitton** and **Radstock** both drawing one apiece.
